# Public Meeting Boulevard Park Shoreline

January 26 Downtown Library 6:30-8:30

# City seeks input on design of Boulevard Park shoreline <a href="http://www.piersystem.com/go/site/1264/">http://www.piersystem.com/go/site/1264/</a>

City officials invite members of the public to a meeting Jan. 26 to gather feedback about the design of improvements to the Boulevard Park shoreline. The meeting is planned for 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. Jan. 26 at the Library Lecture Room, 210 Central Avenue, Bellingham.

Bellingham Parks & Recreation is seeking input on the <u>design of beach access and shoreline improvements at Boulevard Park</u>. Shoreline improvements are necessary to fix erosion-related damage and prevent similar problems in the future. Proposed improvements include removing concrete rubble along portions of the shoreline, creating a sand and gravel beach, and creating sandstone drifts. The design may include converting portions of the existing lawn to a gravel and sand beach. The preliminary design concept from a 2008 feasibility study will be presented at the meeting. The <u>shoreline improvement project</u> is one of several currently underway at Boulevard Park, including nearly-complete <u>renovations to the Pattle Point trestle</u> and design and permitting for an <u>overwater walkway from Boulevard Park to Cornwall Avenue</u>.

Information including environmental permitting, site constraints, budget and preliminary design concept for Boulevard Park shoreline improvements will be presented at this meeting. A formal presentation will be followed by a question and answer period.
